Monthly Report

The Police Department will be hosting two hunter sight-in clinics at the police range. The first one on Saturday, November 5th from 11am-1pm and the second one on Saturday, November 12th from 11am-1pm. Hunters must bring their weapon cased and unloaded as well as have eye and hearing protection.

The Police Department will be hosting its first fall K9 Youth Dance on Friday, November 11th, at the Mayville Park Pavilion. The dance is from 7:00pm until 9:30pm and is chaperoned by police staff and citizen volunteers.

Today, the Mayville Police Department turned over 100 pounds of prescription drugs collected through our lobby drop box. The drugs will be taken to an incinerator and destroyed. So far this year we have collected over 150 pounds of prescription drugs. I want to thank all the Mayville citizens who participate in this free program. The drug drop box is available in our lobby every weekday from 8:00am until 4:00pm.

Captain Vossekuil was the guest speaker for the Parkview Primary Cardinal-Way Assembly on September 30th. He gave a safety talk to the Kindergarten through second graders and parents about safety and making good choices. Capt. Vossekuil was also the guest speaker at Mayville Middle School on October 19th. He gave a presentation to the 7th and 8th grade students about respect and bullying.

Personnel Update

Officer Birch and K9 Boja are currently in training. Boja has been sick and had to take a week off of training. Boja did get a doctor's note excusing her from training.

We are currently reviewing seven applications to determine the number of candidates to be sent to the PFC for consideration of the part-time officer positions. All candidates hired for the four positions will require training to some extent.

Equipment Update

Squad 15 (K9 Vehicle) has been experiencing issues with the air conditioning sporadically cutting off which poses a hazard to the dog. We are working with Ford to determine the cause of issue.

Emergency Government

Was asked to look into the option of manual testing of sirens. Spoke to vendor who services our sirens and was advised that a ladder and special tools would be required to access the control box in order to conduct manual tests. Sirens tested weekly and citizens and officers on patrol already report any non-functioning sirens.
