Item #8– Discuss Ordinance 397-7, Section T, Parking Restrictions. As created with 712-1990 (An Ordinance Restricting Parking on Highways and in Residence Districts – Vehicles Weighing More Than 20,000 Pounds or Exceeding 30 Feet in Length) and Amended with Ordinance 899-2000 (An Ordinance Amending Section 7.07 (19) of the Mayville Municipal Code Relating to the Parking of Travel Trailers on City Streets).

Ald. Voss started the discussion of the ordinance. It was discussed that the ordinance is being enforced as it is currently in the Municipal Code. Ald. Smith questioned whether this included a F450 Truck type with a tongue where the bed would be for a fifth wheel hauling and does it include the tractor without the trailer?
