

The meeting was called to Order by Ald. Moede with the following Roll Call at 6:30 p.m.

Item #2–Approve the minutes of the July 20, 2009, meeting.

Motion by Ald. Smith, second by Ald. Moede to approve the above minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Item #3–Citizens Comments.

Marge Nitschke, 232 N Henninger, commented about Mr. Schmidt’s building signs stating Trusses. She noted we already have Trusses Plus in town, and she understands they were not contacted and feels bad because these people are working less hours.

Marty Waggoner of 30 N Ewald Street commented that he met with MEC about the noise and vibration. The residents are giving MEC time to remedy the situation and will not know if the changes will work until September 15, 2009, and are ready to take the next step if they need to. They were told that MEC would try to close 3rd shift, but the next night 3rd shift was running. He just wanted to note the book is still open on the noise issue.

Matt Kuehn of 810 Bridge Street commented that the noise continues. MEC is running larger presses harder, more often now. Matt says that they have had to meet with MEC one on one.

Ald. Moede stated that he has talked to Rick Torn and Bob Kamphuis and asked that MEC be given another month or so. They are working on the issue with padding. It will take time. Ald. Moede noted that they are big pads that go under the presses.

Item #6–Monthly Police Department Report.

A. Statistical Report/Investigations.

Police Captain, Chris MacNeill, reported the Mayville Police Department Statistics for the past month, since July 17 or 18. There was 1 animal bite, 35 crime arrests, 19 disorderly conducts, 8 domestic disputes, 6 harassment complaints, 22 thefts, 11 worthless checks, 5 accidents, and 76 personal assists. There have been 198 complaints, 238 follow up reports and 1,119 reports.

B. Investigations.

Police Captain, Chris MacNeill, reported that the department currently has 10 open cases under investigation at this time.

C. Smart Patrol Program.

Chief of Police, Bill Linzenmeyer, reported that the Smart Patrol Program is a program put into effect last March. The patrol parks in each ward for approximately twenty minutes. The car is turned off; thus saving mileage and gas for the patrol car. Residents like it and remember seeing a car parked in their area. Ald. Moede commented that he has heard good comments about this program. Ald. Gering agreed that people like the visibility. Ald. Voss noted that he has not seen the police cycle out. Bill stated that it depends on the availability of an officer that has had the proper training. Ald. Pasbrig questioned the cost of the police cycle. Bill noted that it is

\$100 per month. Ald. Smith commented that it is \$100 per month plus the proper gear and training.

B. Development of a Citizen Patrol Program.

Chief of Police, Bill Linzenmeyer, stated that he is in the early steps of putting together a “posse” that would interact with other departments in the City. He will come back with more dialogue at a future meeting.

Item #8– Discussion of Noise Level and Traffic Plans for MEC’s Horicon Street Location.

Ald. Moede opened the discussion up from the citizen’s comments. Ald. Smith stated that better communication is needed from both sides. Ald. Pasbrig commented that the conversations need to be one on one with a friendly conclusion. Ald. Smith commented that this is not solved yet, and MEC will live up to what they should do as good citizens. Ald. Hoy questioned the gallery what time the noise is heard. Matt Kuehn answered that during 11 pm to 4 am, loud vibration. Ald. Hoy asked if it was louder during the day. Matt answered he is not home during the day. And Unknown resident commented that it varies from day to day and is very sporadic, but when it does sound it is a constant pounding and nuisance.

Ald. Smith stated that he was skeptical at first. The noise is not uniform from house to house. He believes there is a vibration, with a sub-strata underground.

Unknown stated that MEC did not think this through. She will not stop until it is silent. She is really discouraged. She noted that the City did not know what was going on, and it has caused havoc in their neighborhood. The entire summer has been grief and fighting. She questioned if the pits are installed legally or up to standards. She went on that they will continue with an attorney if the situation does not change.

Ald. Moede noted to give MEC a chance to remedy the situation.

Item #9–Discuss/Approve Picnic License for Mayville Area Chamber of Commerce – Audubon Days Festival, October 1, 2009 – October 4, 2009.

Ald. Moede invited Kim Weinberger to the podium to speak. Kim gave the upcoming highlights for Audubon Days and noted the changes from last year. This year on Friday there will a teen dance instead of the adult band. Also, on Saturday there will not be dock dogs, there will be a magician, clowns and a hypnotist. Ald. Smith made a motion to approve the Picnic License for Mayville Area Chamber of Commerce – Audubon Days Festival, October 1, 2009 – October 4, 2009. Motion seconded by Ald. Voss. Motion carried unanimously.

Item #10–Discuss/Recommend Extension of Time Period for Commencement of Operations for El Azteca Liquor License.

Ald. Moede invited Sergio to the Podium to speak about the El Azteca Restaurant. Sergio commented that the restaurant is almost finished. There have been issues such as lighting fixtures received broken that had to be returned and equipment that has been received as electric when it was ordered gas. Sergio stated that the Health Department is to come next week. Ald. Moede requested that the Clerk, Deanna Boldrey, read Chapter 247-10, section D and e:mail from the city attorney. Captain MacNeill stated that Police Department inspection still needs to be completed. Ald. Smith made a motion to recommend an extension of opening until October 1, 2009. Motion seconded by Ald. Voss. Motion carried unanimously.

Item #14–Adjournment.
