Item #4 - Monthly Fire Department Report.

A. Wisconsin State Firefighters Memorial.

He wants to get permission for them to send one truck. The only cost to the city is the fuel. There is no pay to the fireman. The committee didn't see a problem with them taking one truck.

Sabel brought up if they could put some type of blacktop road in going past the outdoor pool area to eliminate the congestion only during the school year. Ald. Sabel would like to have
