Item #8- Discuss Neighborhood Electric Vehicle Ordinance

Chief Linzenmeyer explained that he had given to everyone samples of neighborhood electric vehicle ordinances that he had collected from other municipalities. He wants the council to look over the ordinances and decide if they feel we want to have this type of ordinance. There was some discussion as to if we need to get department of transportation approval. The Chief explained that he hasn't looked into that yet because he wanted to make sure that the council was interested in having this type of ordinance. He feels this is a good time to start looking into the ordinance so we will have time to have the ordinance done by spring. Kathie explained that he put a request out on the clerk's network for samples of this type of ordinance. She received a lot of responses which means a lot of municipalities have this type of ordinance. Ald. Hoy expressed that she would like to see this type of ordinance. Ald. Smith commended the Chief for looking into this and bringing up this ordinance. The committee agreed that this would be a good ordinance to have. This will be brought back again in a few months for further discussion.

Item #9-Discuss/Approve Putting Planters in Front of Tattoo Shop on Bridge Street.

Kate Liebenow from Main Street Mayville explained that the owners of the tattoo shop on Bridge Street have requested to have some planters put in front of their shop. She had contacted Mike Kurutz and he said that there were some old planters left that are being stored at the Tag Center. Kate also explained that the owners of Marsibilio's have also requested a planter to be put in front of their restaurant. Kate explained that they do request that the business owners take care of the planters and that if they don't they do have some volunteers that will take care of them. Vern expressed that we have four small planters left and that they don't match the new ones that are on Main Street. Ald. Pasbrig expressed that he thought that taking care of the planters should be a requirement for them to receive one in front of their building. He would like the businesses to receive something in writing stating the guidelines. Kate will work on drawing up a letter. Motion by Ald. Voss, second by Ald. Smith to table item. Motion carried unanimously.
