Item #4 - Monthly Fire Department Report.

E. Donation to K9 Fund from Piggly Wiggly Kids Day.

F. New Post Office Drop Box Location.

The Chief reported that the chute on the post office drop box by the post office has been removed. A post office drop box with a chute has now been placed in the City Hall parking lot.

There has been some concern that citizens are dropping their water bills in the post office box instead of the city drop box. The water department has been paying the postage due on these envelopes. Ron Wellner reported that in the future the water department will be charging the customer for any postage that has to be paid. They have labeled the city drop box with more signs and have also put a flier in the most recent water bills. Things have gotten better.

G. Update on Audubon Days Event.

Captain Poellot reported that things went well. They had some occurrences that they responded to which included some cars that had some windows smashed out and also a burglary. They had some citizen's police academy alumni volunteers doing some patrol in areas with a lot of parked cars. The Captain thanked the CPA and also the Dodge County Emergency Response System for all their help over the weekend. The Captain reported that after the bed races they had a problem with clearing off people from drinking in the street. At 8:00 P.M. there was till around 100 people drinking in the street. The Captain wanted to make the council aware of the situation and that they will need to look into a stricter approach next year.

There will be a Halloween youth dance on October 19th from 7:00 P.M.-9:30 P.M. at the Park Pavilion. The dance will be chaperoned by police and CPA members. All proceeds will go to the K9 fund.
