RE: Report to Public Works for meeting June 16, 2009

I will not be attending tonight's meetings as I have come down with a cold and can hardly talk.

- **Ultra Violet Disinfection Wastewater Treatment Plant**
On June 2nd Trojan Technologies gave a presentation in regards to ultra violet disinfection. The Commission has asked that this subject be placed on the July Commission Agenda for further discussion and possible action. Estimates show a greater than \$21,000 annual savings using UV instead of chlorine.
- **Water main Valve Exercising**
We exercise approximately 1/2 of the valves in the water system each year. This year we are exercising the east side of town. We are about 1/3 done with this project.
- **Sewer Jetting**
We clean about 60% of the sanitary sewer system each year, half plus trouble areas that get cleaned every year. We are about 1/3 done with this project too. As with the valve exercising a summer helper assists a full time employee so we may complete both of these projects over the course of the summer.
- **Phosphorus Loadings**
The last week of May both Mayville Engineering and Old Fashioned Foods dumped high levels of phosphorus into the wastewater stream. Both Industries were contacted and the problem is now under control. The dumping nearly made us violate our discharge permit. Phosphorus is removed by ferric chloride addition at the wastewater treatment plant; the problem is that if an Industry dumps, we do not have enough chemical being added to precipitate out the phosphorus. I asked the Industries to inform us any time an accidental discharge occurs.

- 2008 Consumer Confidence Report
The CCR has been approved by the DNR and was printed as required in the June 4th Mayville News.
- 2008 Electronic Compliance Maintenance Annual Report (Wastewater)
This report is graded from 0.0 to 4.0 grade point average zero being an F and 4.0 being an A. We scored 3.76, a strong score. This means no action needs to be taken with improving our wastewater system. We did however, score a D in our collection system, which is the only reason we did not have a 4.0 score. The Reason for the D was the June flooding last year. During that flood we had to by pass at Barwig Liftstation, at Main and Bridge Streets and the wastewater plant. All 3 count as separate instances even though they occurred at the same time due to the same thing.
- Leroy Water Meter Reading
The Village of Leroy asked the Utility if we would read their electronic water meters if they had them installed. Although I recommend against it the Commission thought it would be a good faith gesture and approved the request at the following rates: \$3.00 per meter reading during normal reading, and \$85.00 for an individual read such as a move in and move out. I forwarded the Commission's response to the Leroy board. We will make about a \$2000 per year profit from the reading if enacted.
