

CLEAN SWEEP GUIDELINES

- ◆ Each farm or household may bring any amount of hazardous waste for free disposal.
- ◆ Materials should be properly identified with their original labels.
- ◆ DO NOT mix materials together. Doing so can be extremely dangerous!
- ◆ Pack materials for your safety. Place materials in a cardboard box lined with a plastic bag. Separate each product with a folded newspaper.
- ◆ If a container is leaking, put it into a secondary leak-proof container.
- ◆ Pack containers in the trunk of your vehicle, away from the driver, passengers and pets.
- ◆ Unknown materials can be brought in, but Dodge County and its hazardous waste disposal contractor reserve the right to refuse any material.

ACCEPTABLE AGRICULTURAL MATERIALS

Damaged, canceled, banned, or otherwise unwanted agricultural chemicals.

2,4-d	herbicides
ddt	insecticides
2,4,5-t or	wood preservatives
silvex	chlordane
fungicides	rodent bait
Other pesticides, animal medications & sharps	

MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

The following materials will not be accepted due to restrictions imposed by the environmental protection agency, the hazardous waste disposal company, or the Dodge County clean sweep steering committee.

Explosives (ammunition, fireworks, etc.); human medical & biological wastes including infectious wastes; latex paints (non-lead based); radioactive materials (smoke detectors); compressed gas cylinders; shock or heat sensitive materials such as ether, peroxide or picric acid; used motor oil; fertilizer; tires; asbestos; anti-freeze, or alkaline batteries—(throw alkaline batteries in your trash!)



CLEAN SWEEP

Clean sweep is a limited time collection of unwanted, unused or damaged agricultural or household hazardous wastes and pharmaceuticals. This program collects, treats, stores, or disposes of waste in an environmentally safe method through a licensed hazardous waste facility. Hazardous wastes can usually be identified by product labels which contain any of the following words: caution, warning, danger, poison, toxic, ignitable or flammable, acid, corrosive, or reactive.

NO LATEX PAINT ACCEPTED AT THE CLEAN SWEEP!



WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH LATEX PAINT?

Air dry liquid latex paint in the can by removing the lid. To speed up this process, you can mix sand, cement, plaster of paris or kitty litter with the paint. Once dried, you can dispose of your dried paint/can with your garbage.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- ◇ All residents of any county are eligible to participate.
- ◇ Farms and businesses need to pre-register.
- ◇ Household clean sweep items can be taken to any location at the times given.
- ◇ Pharmaceuticals can be discarded at the Theiler Park and Beaver Dam site. Details in this brochure.

PHARMACEUTICAL COLLECTION

AT THE MAYVILLE AND BEAVER DAM SITE LOCATIONS

ACCEPTED:

- ◇ Inhalers
- ◇ Liquids
- ◇ Pills
- ◇ Over the counter items
- ◇ Pet meds
- ◇ Creams

Keep medications in their original containers. You may cross out your name, but keep the prescription name and dosage on the container.

VERY SMALL QUANTITY GENERATOR (VSQG) PROGRAM

A VSQG is a small business that generates less than 2,205 lbs of legally defined hazardous waste.

Small businesses can take advantage of the lower collection and disposal rates negotiated by the state of Wisconsin for household and agricultural hazardous waste collection programs. Agricultural small businesses are also eligible to receive a 50% cost share from state pesticide funds, lowering the cost even more. To participate, call the UW-Extension office, 920-386-3790 by September 10.

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED FOR AG & VSQG BUSINESS COLLECTION

Register by calling Dodge County UW-Extension office at 920-386-3790 between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday.

Only phone reservations will be accepted. Register before Wednesday, September 5 for VSQG and Monday, September 10 for Ag.

Be prepared to estimate the amount of material you will be bringing (pounds of dry and gallons of liquid)
